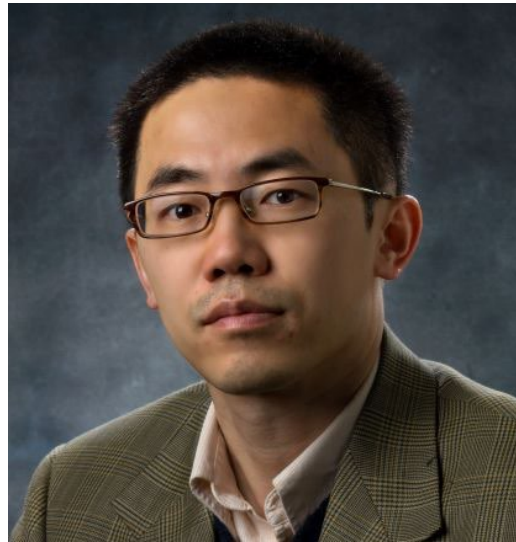

Dr. Xinzhi Zhang is the Chief of Health Inequities and Global Health Branch at the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute (NHLBI), National Institutes of Health. Prior to that, he was a program director in the National Center for Advancing Translational Sciences (NCATS), and the National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities (NIMHD). He was a senior medical epidemiologist at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Dr. Zhang has authored 4 papers for inclusion in CDC's [*Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report*](#), 3 book chapters, and 73 articles published in peer-reviewed journals, including the *Journal of the American Medical Association*. He is one of the editors of the 2021 textbook on [*The Science of Health Disparities Research*](#) and served as the interim Editor-in-Chief of journal [*Health Equity*](#). Throughout his career, Dr. Zhang has received many honors and awards from NIH, CDC, AHRQ, American Public Health Association (APHA), and U.S. Public Health Service, including Secretary's Award for Distinguished Service, Hubert H. Humphrey Award for Service to America, 4 NIH Director's Awards, 2 Presidential Unit Citations, and 2 Outstanding Service Medals. Dr. Zhang received his M.D. from Peking Union Medical College in 1998 and his Ph.D. in health services administration from the University of Alabama at Birmingham in 2003.
